Comprehensive Report on Training Programme

Day One (15 April, 2018)

Session One: Inaugural Function

The inaugural witnessed the presence of all 21 participants that included senior faculty, HOD's, members, Directors and Principals from different academic institutions such as Idyllic Institute of Management, IIL's, Govt. College Mhow, Depalpur, Indore., SIPS, SOE, SOP, SOLS, SCMGC. In the inauguration function **Professor Rajneesh Jain, Secretary UGC New Delhi** was vocal about the academic freedom of the teachers. He addressed the need to groom the newly inducted teachers for the growing need of learning, teaching in the classrooms which included the use of high tech infra structure, latest techniques and trends around the globe and also inside our country. He discussed E-learning modules, digitalization, and research oriented course, along with vast options to include and improve the traditional segments of the courses. **Professor P.B. Sharma, President AIU, VC, Amity University, Gurgaon** opined the greatest need of the hour in Higher Education is to have institutional belongingness, to spread the relevance of education and the role of the universities to propagate career oriented and life centered education for overall development of the universities which will encourage mass entrepreneurs. **Dr. Narendra Dhakad, VC DAVV, Indore** focused in his inaugural speech the role of accreditation. In today's scenario, a teacher should act like a manager with clear vision and mission to improve the quality of academics. They should orient themselves with what is latest in their subjects to give knowledge to the students. They should perform and act like pioneers in their fields. A teacher is a manager of education. **Dr. Namrata Sharma, Director, UGC HRDC, DAVV Indore** laid emphasis on leadership skills in a teacher that will help to lead the students in the path of complete knowledge. Being well versed in communication skills, a teacher enhances the quality of education and improves in personality development of the students.

Session Two: Academic Leadership by Professor P.B. Sharma, President AIU, VC, Amity University, Gurgaon

The second session began with an introductory session by Prof. P.B. Sharma. He discussed in detail on Academic Leadership. He discussed about the future scenario of Academics. He discussed what will be the universities of tomorrow, Science of tomorrow and its wellness, lifecycle, Nature, Integrity in the future. He highlighted the 21st Century Leadership and two speed Leadership. He said that the Leadership for Academics excellence, Leadership for Research Excellence translating our Research into new wealth.

Session Third & Fourth: ACCREDITATION: NAAC and IQAC by Dr. Vishnu Kant Chatapalli, Adviser, NAAC, Bangalore

Dr. Vishnukant Chetapalli focused on Accreditation. Accreditation is a bird eyed view used for understanding the quality status of an institution. He shed light on the NAAC as an autonomous body of UGC that upholds the highest bench marks to accredit an institution in the main stream of standards by UGC. IQAC is an integral part of NAAC that predefines the quality of academics in all the universities. The Day one was marked by topics that were taken by the expert and a liveliness of ease of learning was prompted by them. They all encouraged question time by the participants and quick to respond to all the queries.

Day Two (16 April,2018)

Session One: HIGH IMPACT PRACTICES FOR STUDENT SUCCESS by Professor Y. Narsinghulu, VC, Rayalseema, Kunnor

In Session one of Day two, Prof. Y. Narsinghulu discussed about the High Impact Practices for Student Success. For a teacher that most important job is to know the mind set , thought and an over estimation of the expectations of the students. It is very important for any teacher to get involved in the process of “know your students” which starts with bridge classes, zero classes and introductory classes. Teacher should also build a brand “ YOU” to stand apart in his subjective field by improving himself on the daily basis in his knowledge domain, values, communicative skills, E-ship and should update himself in all the best teaching and learning practices.

Session Two: INSTITUTIONAL PERFORMANCE AND BETTER GOVERNANCE by Professor Y. Narsinghulu, VC, Rayalseema, Kunnor

Prof. Y. Narsinghulu engaged one more session which was on Institutional framework and better Governance. Here he focused on the Governance Issues in Academic Institutions. He dealt in detail about the different authorities and officers at academic institutions and other bodies viz Court, Executive Council, Academic Council, Visitor, Chancellor, Vice Chancellor etc.

Session Three & Four: RESEARCH QUALITY AND ADMINISTRATION; GLOBAL SCENARIO BY Professor D.K. Verma, Dean Academics, Baba Sahib Ambedkar University, Mhow

Prof D. K. Verma focused on the Global Scenario of Research Quality and Administration. He discussed the Teaching Learning Environment and the Universal World Ranking in light of Research and Administration. He also explained the methodology of Research, Research Paper and Review of Literature. At last , he concluded that the Professors are the producers of Knowledge, Readers are one who reads the knowledge in front of student and the Lecturer are one who can delivers the Lecture so make our Research Qualitative and effective to groom our teaching.

Day Three (17 April,2018)

Session One: CURRICULUM AND CURRICULAR DEVELOPMENT by Professor Rishikesh T. Krishnan, Director, IIM Indore

Day three began with a session on Curriculum and Curricular Development and Excellence in Higher Education by Prof. Rishikesh T. Krishnan. He firstly started his session with the term Mission. According to him, Our Mission should be different from others, which have some uniqueness which make it special one. It involves the social sensitivity and Industrial Familiarization too. He also discussed the Learning objectives in light of curricular development. He said that our focus should be on Learning not teaching. We should follow the principle of Learning by doing. Here he said that the curriculum must have discussion learning, blended learning, and experiential learning.

Session Two: E-GOVERNANCE IN HIGHER EDUCATION by Dr. Sanjeev Sharma, Director CIS, JNU, New Delhi

Dr. Sanjeev Sharma conducted session two on E- Governance in Higher Education. He started with the massive open online course (MOOC) which is an online course aimed at unlimited participation and open access via the web. In addition to traditional course materials such as filmed lectures, readings, and problem sets, many MOOCs provide interactive user forums to support community interactions among students. Then he discussed about SWAYAM or Study Webs of Active –Learning for Young Aspiring Minds programme of Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India. SWAYAM is an instrument for self-actualization providing

opportunities for a life-long learning. SWAYAM presents a unique educational opportunity to expand the horizons of knowledge. He explained the features of Interacted Voice Recording System (IVRS), Bring Your Own Device (BYOD) and other student faculty admin aid provider which helps the students and Faculties Online.

Session Three: INTERNATIONALIZATION OF HIGHER EDUCATION by Dr. C. B. Sharma, Chairman, NIOS, Delhi

Session three of Day three focused on Internationalization of Higher Education by Dr. C. B. Sharma. He discussed firstly on the term Internationalization in light of Education. He said that there are a lot of resources available worldwide but the teachers are the one who creates resources for their students. They can only helps in the global recognition of higher education. The best teachers and the students highlights the country's economy at global level.

Session Four: DISTRIBUTED LEADERSHIP AND DIFFUSION OF AUTHORITY AND DELEGATION by Dr. P.K. Chande, Director, SVKM's NMIMS, Indore

Dr. P. K. Chande focused on Distributed Leadership, Diffusion of Authority and Delegation of Authority. He discussed with the participants various qualities that are required to be a good academic leader in the current scenario. Quoting different examples, he said that being an academic leader is essential now in order to grow and excel in academics. Then he explained the importance and role of Diffusion and Delegation of Authority. He concluded that Look at Yourself is the best practice ever.

Day Four (18 April,2018)

Session One & Two: SELF FINANCING MODELS IN HIGHER EDUCATION by Professor M. K. Verma, Vice Chancellor, Chhattisgarh Swami Vivekanand Technical University, Bhilai

Day began with the Self Financing Models in Higher Education by Professor M.K. Verma. He started the session with the financial matters at different academic institutions with focus on role with self financing models. In light of this, he elaborated Social responsibilities of Universities and students which includes the different projects like Solar Energy, IT enable Villages, donation of Computers, carrier guidance, Portable water & Electricity generation through Solar Energy. Secondly he discussed the forum of Indian Technical Universities which includes Automation of University Admin, Video Conference Network, Solar Energy Campus etc.

Session Three: FEDERAL AND STATE SYSTEM OF HIGHER EDUCATION IN INDIA by Dr. Girishwar Mishra, VC, MG, Antartrashtriya, Hindi University, Wardha

Education in India is provided by the public sector as well as the private sector, with control and funding coming from three levels: Central, State and local. Under various articles of the Indian Constitution, free and compulsory education is provided as a fundamental right to children between the ages of 6 and 14. The ratio of public schools to private schools in India is 7:5.
